


National Portrait Gallery Occupational Health and Safety Commitment Statement

The National Portrait Gallery (the NPG) is committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy environment for all its employees, contractors and visitors.

It is acknowledged that the environment where the NPG operates is different from the one the Department of Environment, Water, Heritage and Arts (the Department) operates. However, until such a time where it is practicable, all NPG employees, contractors and visitors are required to comply with the Department's relevant Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) policy, procedures, instructions and reporting requirements. All these can be accessed through the Department's dedicated Health and Wellbeing website which is part of the Department's intranet (*select the People section and then select the Health & Wellbeing category where you can find the Department's OHS policy, forms and a wide range of assistance programs for employees and their families*).

It is the intent of the Gallery to develop and maintain a system of OHS that is appropriate for the NPG's environment. The Risk Manager will lead this process which will involve consulting with employees and other relevant stakeholders.

In the meantime, if you have any OHS concern, you should raise it with your manager/supervisor who is the first point of contact. The Risk Manager would assist with providing/facilitating specific expert advice.
