The Collection

Begun in May 1998, the collection continues to grow rapidly. The majority of works in the collection have been gifts thanks to the generosity of donors.

The Gallery is creating a collection of portraits of the highest quality across all media. Two principles guide the selection of portraits for the collection:

- · the subject must be significant in his or her field of endeavour or a known and named person whose life sets them apart as an individual of long-term public interest; and
- the subject must be Australian, either by birth or association.

The Gallery has also established a fund to enable purchases of significant works of art. Donations of cash to this fund are tax deductible

The National Portrait Gallery has an active policy of commissioning portraits. a process which supports development of the collection.

Director's Foreword

This issue of the National Portrait Gallery's magazine is devoted to a review of the highlights of the gallery's activities in 2001. Our first Year in Review, a modest production, unillustrated, was produced in 2000. Last year we set the retrospective glance in an electronic publication. This year, we take the opportunity offered by the Gallery's recently launched magazine **Portrait** for this snapshot of the year 2001.

2001 was a year in which the Gallery consolidated and deepened its commitment to its aim – to bring portraits and the people depicted in them to the Australian public. 180,000 people visited the Gallery in Old Parliament House and many thousands more were able to experience the Gallery through interstate public programs, through our travelling exhibitions, the Gallery's website and **Portrait** magazine.

2001 also saw a very practical and particular manifestation of public support for the Gallery. In August we launched our *Circle of Friends*. Since the Gallery opened in its expanded and re-furbished spaces in March 1999 many people approached me with the question 'How can we sign up? What can we do to help the Gallery?' By 2001 there was a clearly identifiable and gratifying groundswell of support for the idea of a Friend's organisation and with a dedicated and imaginative committee we worked towards its establishment. Many hundreds of people have taken up the opportunity to show their support of the Gallery by becoming members of the *Circle of Friends*.

The gallery's collection was enriched greatly in 2001 by some magnificent gifts, all of which are listed and some of which (sufficient only to demonstrate the range of the Gallery's collections) are illustrated here. As it has from Day One, the Gallery continues to enjoy the support of a band of benefactors and sponsors who believe in the importance of our portrait heritage. Yet another dimension of the Gallery's collection-building was further developed in 2001 – the commissioning of portraits of contemporary interest. The latest of these to be unveiled graces the cover of this journal.

Exhibitions (the majority originated by the National Portrait Gallery) continued to reflect the Gallery's diversity of interests. Similarly the Gallery's public programs – commencing in March with Neil MacGregor's brilliant Anniversary Lecture and concluding with a wellattended and stimulating seminar in Hobart – continued our commitment to discussion, research and the wide dissemination of ideas to a national audience.

With its energetic and strongly focussed Board, its excellent staff, the good levels of government and public support it enjoys, the Gallery has developed a strong foundation. In 2001, with the addition of an organisation through which the wider public can become practically involved, the future of the Gallery is looking ever stronger.






