Dear Senator Brandis

In December 2013 the National Portrait Gallery will present the exhibition Elvis at 21, Photographs by Alfred Wertheimer, a photographic journey featuring works chronicling Elvis' dazzling emergence in 1956.

Accompanying Elvis on the road, in concert, recording, and at home in Memphis, Alfred Wertheimer documented Presley's meteoric rise in the year he catapulted from anonymity to superstardom.

Taken in 1956 the rarely seen photographs show Elvis as an unknown off stage, able to ride unnoticed on the train, mixing with friends and family and strangers alike. The images are remarkably candid, intimate and fresh, offering a glimpse at the magnetic and youthful appeal of the young Elvis. The 56 pigment prints radiate a richness and depth and document a rare moment in time before Elvis became an icon.

Elvis at 21, Photographs by Alfred Wertheimer was developed collaboratively by the Smithsonian's National Portrait Gallery, the Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibition Service. The exhibition is also supported through the ACT Government's Special Event Fund.

The National Portrait Gallery is the only Australian venue and will present the exhibition from 7 December 2013 to 10 March 2014.

On behalf of the National Portrait Gallery of Australia, the Board and Board Chairman, Dr Helen Nugent AO, I write to invite you to be part of the official launch of Elvis 21, Photographs by Alfred Wertheimer on Friday 6 December at 6:00pm.

Dear Minister

I write to cordially invite you to officially open the *National Photographic Portrait Prize* 2014, which will be launched on the evening of <u>Friday 21 March 2014</u> at 6pm.

The *National Photographic Portrait Prize* is an annual event intended to promote the very best in contemporary photographic portraiture by both professional and aspiring Australian photographers. With a prize valued at \$25,000, it is considered one of the premier photographic prizes in Australia.

This year – the sixth in the *Prize's* history - the Gallery received over 1400 entries, which the expert judging panel have with great care whittled to the 45 finalists whose works will be on display.

Following its exhibition in Canberra, the NPPP2014 will embark on a national tour to regional centres including Wagga Wagga, Cowra, Wangaratta and Devonport. To date, the NPPP has toured to 19 regional venues across New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Western Australia and South Australia, attracting close to 65,000 visitors. The NPPP2014 is supported by the National Collecting Institutions Touring and Outreach Program.

In addition to the announcement of the NPPP2014 prize winner, the Gallery will simultaneously launch a second but equally important exhibition entitled Promo – portraits from prime time, which goes behind-the-scenes and into the spotlight with professional photographers and the stars of TV, music and comedy. We hope to attract a good few of those portrait subjects to the launch on the 21st which is shaping up to be a colourful and busy evening!

Your support of this dual exhibition opening will be greatly valued by the Gallery's Board and our new Director, Angus Trumble. I do hope your schedule will allow your attendance at this very special event.
